### 4. DELEGATIONS

## (a) Strengthening Hope Project

Yves Trudel was in attendance to present Council regarding the Strengthening Hope Homelessness Project. In his presentation, Mr. Trudel covered the following points:

- Components of the Stengthening Hope Homelessness Project:
  - Expanding support to vulnerable unhoused persons through additional evening outreach and supports
  - Education, training and capacity building
  - Community engagement
  - Improved coordination assessment of community services
  - Project oversight
- What we know about homelessness in Hope:
  - o Homelessness is trending up in Hope since 2014
  - o In the FVRD, the per capita increase in Hope is the second highest
  - Males are the majority
  - Indigenous persons are overrepresented
  - Seniors and others need ongoing supportive housing
  - Persistent prevalence of chronic homeless persons and those using health impacting substances, person with mental health issues and/or other health related ailments
- Causes of homelessness:
  - High rent
  - o Inadequate supply of affordable, suitable and supportive housing
  - Use of health impacting substances
  - Mental health issues
  - Family/relational breakdown
- Progress on supports in Hope:
  - Existing affordable and suitable housing (The Ryder by Anhart, The Riverstone by MQHS)
  - Continuing improvements in care related to mental health and addictions (IHART)
  - Upcoming supportive housing facility in partnership with BC Housing
- Upcoming community engagement:
  - Community Dialogue Session February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023
  - o On-line survey of residents in Hope on the United Way of BC website
  - Project findings validation meeting February/March 2023

## (b) United Way British Columbia

Yves Trudel, on behalf of United Way British Columbia, was in attendance to provide an update on local social issues and to share information about United Way investments, solutions and effective partnerships. In his presentation, Mr. Trudel covered the following points:

- Common challenges face by communities in BC:
  - Lack of access to basic needs and effects of inflation
  - Rising cost of housing
  - o Increased demand on critical social community services
  - Need for rapid & coordinated response to emergencies
- United Way's community impact and investments:
  - \$50,000 for Emergent Response (United for Floods)
  - \$140,000 for Support for Seniors (Better at Home, Emergency Preparedness)
  - \$180,000 in regional Food Security for the Upper Fraser Valley

Council inquired as to how much funding is available and who is able to apply. A representative from HATS advised Council that by applying for the RFP, both the rent supplement program and the non-clinical supports are included. She noted that no caps are mentioned, but a minimum of ten packages of \$600 in rent supplement will be available. Currently, they are operating a supplement program with a \$1,800 budget, and hope that this will increase the scope to be able to help families. Individuals are assessed based on the application process for their needs, and the supplement will follow them outside of the community.

- He met with the RCMP Superintendent and Inspector to begin planning for an update to Council in the new year on changes within the RCMP.
- He attended the lighting of the Christmas Tree on December 3<sup>rd</sup> at District Hall, and thanked the Lions Club for the tree and Hope Towing for the Santa ride-along.
- He attended the International Volunteer Day hosted by the Read Right Society, thanking the volunteers in the District.
- He attended the Cascade Lower Canyon Community Forest dinner, noting that the Community Forest is making such a difference in our community.
- He attended a training seminar in Chilliwack with the rest of Council.
- He announced that he was looking for support from Council to issue a letter of support to the Tashme Historical Society for their submission to the Next Great Save Fundraising Campaign.

Council inquired as to whether it is only a letter of support that will be issued; the Mayor confirmed that it is.

## 8. PERMITS AND BYLAWS

## (a) Report dated December 5, 2022 from the Director of Community Development Re: Development Variance Permit – 740A Fraser Avenue

A video presentation submitted by the applicant was displayed to Council and those in attendance. David Radmore, owner of 740A Fraser Avenue, voiced his support for the application, noting that he believes that this business will be good for Hope by providing jobs and contribute to economic growth. Mr. Radmore noted that he is confident that the

applicant will provide a safe and secure business setting, and that the provincial guidelines that he must meet are very stringent. On parking, Mr. Radmore noted that he believes there is plenty of parking in the downtown area.

The Director of Corporate Services advised Council that two submissions were received, one from the Christ Church Hope and the other from Hope Veterinary Services. An addendum, including a response from the applicant on the issues brought up in the Vets submissions, was also presented to Council. The Mayor called for additional comments or questions from the public and none were raised. Council inquired as to how often a variance like this occurs; the Director of Community Development advised that as this policy is new, this is the first variance of this kind that has been received. He noted that this variance is to allow for the lawful collection of an application through the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch.

THAT Council approve the issuance of a Development Variance Permit to vary the 100 metre property to property setback requirement for the Institutional (P-2) zone to 70 metres and relax the three (3) required off street parking stalls to on street parking stalls in order to lawfully accept and process a retail sale of cannabis license application through the Province of British Columbia, Liquor & Cannabis Regulation Branch to be located within the building on the parcel legally described as Lot A Section 9 TWP 5 RGE 26 W6M YDYD Plan 12379; PID 006-639-062; 740A Fraser Avenue; and

FURTHER THAT the Director of Community Development be authorized to endorse the Development Variance Permit document; and

FURTHER THAT for the purposes of Section 504 of the *Local Government Act*, "substantially start" shall mean the approval of the retail sale of cannabis application through the Liquor & Cannabis Regulation Branch.

Council inquired as to what happens with the remaining \$2,500 allocated in the budget for Grants-In-Aid; the Director of Finance advised that the policy does not allow the amount to be carried forward and if approved, the \$7,500 would be the amount available. The CAO noted that there were not many applicants, but it is a good indication that community members are accessing other avenues to address their needs such as the Community Forest.

## PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to present a recommended new nominee for the AdvantageHOPE Board as reviewed by the current Board members. Council endorsement is sought for the proposed new member for immediate appointment.

## ANALYSIS:

## A. Rationale:

In accordance with Hope Business and Development Society (AdvantageHOPE) Constitution and Bylaws, Directors are to be elected to serve one-year terms (renewable). Vacancies on the Board of Directors, however caused, may so long as a quorum of Directors remains in office, be filled by the Directors according to the Section 3.5 (d) [Selection Procedures], if they shall see fit to do so, otherwise such vacancy shall be filled at the next Annual General Meeting of the Members at which the Directors for the ensuing year are elected.

The current Board has six vacancies with more Directors being actively recruited. Jeff Kohlman is a life-long Hope resident with considerable professional accounting experience. He also has a business degree from the University of the Fraser Valley. Martin Hendriks has been in the TV/video production business for 30 years. Tannis Hendriks brings with her experience in media sales and account management. The selection process was conducted by the current Board members and approved.

The Board systematically evaluates applicants by contrasting the applicant's skills, experience, and interests against the strengths of the current Board to identify if the new applicants could add experience and expertise in areas identified as lacking.

## **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this report is to ratify the December 15, 2022 telephone poll of Council regarding AdvantageHOPE's and the Fraser Valley Mountain Biker's Association application to the BC Rural Economic Diversification and Infrastructure Program, for funding for trail development and marketing of the Hope Mountain trail network.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT Council ratify the telephone poll of December 15, 2022:

THAT Council of the District of Hope issue a letter of support to the Fraser Valley Mountain Bikers Association, for their partnership with AdvantageHOPE, and grant submission for the Economic Capacity stream of the Province of BC's Rural Economic Diversification and Infrastructure Program, for funding for trail development and marketing of the trail network on Hope Mountain.

## BACKGROUND:

This funding stream will provide up to a maximum of \$100,000 over two years (up to \$50,000 per year for two years), of which up to 100% of project costs are eligible (i.e., no matched funding required). This stream is eligible to small, rural communities with populations of 2,500 or less, which applies to the project given its location (Crown land, within FVRD Electoral Area B – approx. population 1,500). Both AdvantageHOPE and the FVMBA are considered eligible applicants.

The Fraser Valley Mountain Bikers Association (FVMBA) is partnering with AdvantageHOPE to apply for funding, if successful, funding would be used for continued archaeological assessments, permitting, community engagement, capacity building/training/recruitment (youth training on trail building), and project coordination activities. If any funding dollars remain, they would be used for complementary economic development activities, such as a destination marketing and management plan, sustainability action plan, etc.



## Description

As part of a three day field exploration that took place early in December, the following recommendations incorporate feedback from local stakeholders and with reference to the Hope Trails Master Plan. Priority was given to areas that have funding potential through the community forest. Time was spent exploring each of the proposed mountain bike areas as identified in the plan to find the best options for the community moving forward, in addition to ground truthing some areas of this proposed plan.

The following trail concept plan is integrated but modular. On its own, each component could serve as a self sustained trail network, but if built in its entirety will form a comprehensive stacked loop multi-use trail system. High focus was given towards providing the types of trails that locals are interested in using while also recognizing preferences in the greater region to draw in visitors. Maximization of viewscapes, integration of existing trail networks and other existing infrastructure was prioritized.

## Comments on other areas identified in the master plan

- American Creek FSR: Great terrain but with private property issues on the low side and a fair drive for locals from town compared with other terrain. Furthermore, being outside of the community forest means that clear cutting harvests will interfere with the experience. It also limits funding potential.
- 2. Squeah: Looks like excellent terrain but a significant distance to travel for locals in terms of time. It would only take a few more minutes for locals to drive to Vedder Mountain in Chilliwack.
- Silver Skagit: In addition to being far from town, this area has access issues due to physically challenging terrain including multiple cliffs.

### Mount Hope

While not indicated in the master plan, the Mount Hope area contains some of the best possible terrain for mountain bikers in Hope within a close proximity to town. While the terrain is steep, there are many corridors that can be connected to complete a stacked multi-loop system with options for various difficulty levels. Lower down in elevation features excellent terrain for beginner and intermediate trails, and the technically challenging steeper terrain above is appropriate for advanced users. The forests feature some spectacular stands of old growth fir and immense boulder fields. Highlighting these features with creative trail layout will help Hope stand out as a destination riding area.

The hillside can easily be connected to town via a ~4km long trail that traverses from the Mount Hope Forest









Service Road to the Old Hope-Princeton interchange, allowing riders to ride from town. The ability to ride from town is highly sought after in many communities and should be investigated as a high priority. Given the right trail style, 4.5km of descending singletrack that takes place *after* the will provide exceptional experiental value to visitors and locals alike.



The Mount Hope FSR, which connects to the Mt Hope hiking trail at the top, is in rough shape and would benefit from upgrading. That being said, an upgrade is not necessary in order to begin developing and using this area.

## **Development Recommendations**

- 1. Detailed design and construction of descent trails near the bottom (#18, #4, #20, #15, #17) of the FSR.
  - 1. Identify the best location for machine built flow trail and source funding from the community forest and others. This will likely be #18 as road access is convenient but #15 17 is also a good option if more funding is available for building a climb trail.
  - 2. Volunteers begin construction on hand-built technical trails (#4, #20, #1)
- 2. Begin local fundraising and promotion of the value of a connector trail (#2, #5) to the community. The 4km+ trail will likely cost 17500 22500 / km to construct.
- 3. Continue designing and constructing trails upslope as terrain and resources allow.

#### Notes

- Excellent terrain with plenty of old growth fir and combinations of rock and soil and many nautral boulder fields. Usage of all of these features in combinations will make for a unique experience not available in the lower mainland.
- 2. Some terrain is steep and rocky, careful route selection will help to maximize potential of this incredible area.
- Trail layout should maximize the number of different experiences by using optional lines over technical terrain in this somewhat constrained area. This has the added bonus of maximizing the usage of available volunteer trail builder resources.
- 4. As exposure and terrain difficulty increase with elevation, consider leaving the road rough at a given point to act as a filter for shuttlers.
- The town connector trail can be completed at any time. Investment in the riding area on the mountain proper first will likely be the best use of available resources and help solidify resources for development of larger projects.
- 6. There is a strong possibility of accessing high alpine trails from this network. Not without their challenges, alpine trails require careful planning and coordination. Collaboration with other stakeholders is essential to further limit the environmental and user impact of alpine trails.

## Quarry

Quarry zone is limited by the steep terrain of Ogilvie above and the private property bordering Othello road below. There are two access points that avoid private property in addition to the one used currently. These can be used as opportunities to expand access to additional terrain. In addition, the layout allows for the connection of the TCT off of Othello road, which may provide a source of funding for trail construction in this area.

With limited potential due to the terrain, development in this area should be consdered a moderate priority.









RESPECT

Partly this is because using the available space entails spreading the area out geographically, which limits the ability for riders to plan connected laps together without road connections or long shuttles. Development should consist of maximizing the available terrain and raising the profile of Hope/FVMBA for further trail development and capacity building.



# **Development recommendations**

- Detailed layout of tentative Trans Canada Trail connector trail to support funding application for construction (up to 35%). Using the existing skid road as much as possible will help reduce costs.
- 2. Identification and layout of descent trail(s) from along the proposed TCT trail. Concepts for these are provided on the map.
- 3. Assessment of terrain along the indicated area for a third, but very spatially dispersed area

#### Notes

- 1. Development of the TCT trail would provide a connector for the HBC trail directly to town via the KVR
- Othello road can be used to shuttle and/or loop back to town. Connecting along the KVR makes this more interesting.
- 3. Private property issues along othello rd, conversations with landowners should take place.
- 4. Possible funding available through Spectre Energy / Trans Mountain.
- 5. Investigate the opportunity of rerouting the Ogilvie peak trail such that it can be accessed on foot from Othello road. Stakeholder collaboration required here, perhaps the provincial park can become a hub for this hiking trail?

### Peers Creek / Nicolum River Provincial Park

This area was not ground truthed as part of this project, but ingress and egress areas were noted as viable. The expansion into this area would provide an alternative style to the Shuttle / Gravity riding proposed for the Mt Hope area. With few access roads and steep terrain, an all-mountain technical riding area - similar in spirit if not terrain to Squamish's Alice Lake area - is possible. Multiple options for connecting corridors and steep rocky terrain exist according to the maps.

## **Development recommendations**

- Identify the proper contact at BC Parks and investigate their interest in opening up the area to further recreation with trails.
- 2. Assess the feasibility of the lower connector trail, identified on the map. In order for this area to be tenable, this trail must be possible and with a moderate overall grade (5 9% average).
- 3. Identify lookouts that might be popular with day use hikers / visitors.
- Optionally, further expand trails to above and around the knolls, using the rock faces as technical rock features.

### **Summary of Request**

Advantage Hope (lead applicant) and the FVMBA (applicant partner) are applying for the Economic Capacity stream of the Province of BC's Rural Economic Diversification and Infrastructure Program (REDIP), in support of the FVMBA's proposed trail network on Hope Mountain.

This funding stream will provide up to a maximum of \$100,000 over two years (up to \$50,000 per year for two years), of which up to 100% of project costs are eligible (i.e., no matched funding required). This stream is eligible to small, rural communities with populations of 2,500 or less, which applies to the project given its location (Crown land, within FVRD Electoral Area B – approx. population 1,500). Both Advantage Hope and the FVMBA are considered eligible applicants.

If successful, funding would be used for continued archaeological assessments, permitting, community engagement, capacity building/training/recruitment (youth training on trail building), and project coordination activities. If any funding dollars remain, they would be used for complementary economic development activities, such as a destination marketing and management plan, sustainability action plan, etc.

REDIP has secure funding for 3 years and have confirmed future intakes. As such there is an opportunity to apply for the Economic Capacity stream this year and in following years, apply for the Economic Diversification stream (Implementation sub-stream) to source funding for the construction of the trail network.

Advantage Hope and FVMBA are kindly requesting a letter of support from Mayor and Council for this exciting project.

### Summary of Benefits

The benefits this project will provide the District of Hope upon completion include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Focus on inclusivity, accessibility, and sustainability the area surrounding the District of Hope will become
  home to a robust multi-use trail network that can be utilized by all levels of recreational users, including
  mountain bikers, trail runners, hikers, dog walkers, etc. Hope and the surrounding area currently do not have
  trail assets/infrastructure of this type and scale. Trails will be built/maintained in a sustainable and resilient
  manner, adhering to sound best practices with respect to erosion control measures around riparian areas and
  steep slopes, informational/safety signage for trail users, and avoiding trail activities in Wildlife Habitat Areas
  (WHAs) and fish bearing streams.
- 2. Due to the size and scale of the proposed trail network, the District of Hope can become a destination for mountain bikers to stay and visit as opposed to just driving through leading to more room stays, visits to dining and drinking establishments and a general uptick in tourism dollars. In a 2018 study it was determined the average party of mountain bikers (party size of 3) visiting Squamish on a day trip spent \$265.21 and that bumped up to \$517.85 when they were overnight stays.

In partnership with Advantage Hope and with assistance from <u>Clear Course Consulting</u>, which has been contracted by Destination BC to assist local organizations with grant applications to acquire funding to develop tourism assets and infrastructure, we are applying for an Economic Capacity Grant through the Province of British Columbia's Rural Economic Diversification and Infrastructure Program (<u>REDIP</u>).

# PURPOSE:

To obtain Council's authorization for staff to proceed with the legislative process to redesignate and rezone the property at 61954 Estell Road to allow for a future industrial development.

# **RECOMMENDATION #1:**

THAT District of Hope Official Community Plan Amendment Bylaw No.1539, 2023 be given first and second readings in order to redesignate the land use designation in the Official Community Plan the property legally described as Lot 6, Except Part on Plan 73383 Section 1 Township 5 Range 27 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> Meridian New Westminster District Plan 17065; PID 010-311-637; 61954 Estell Road from Highway Commercial to Light/Service Industry; and

FURTHER THAT the public be notified in accordance with the District of Hope Application Procedures and Public Hearing/Information Meeting Procedural Bylaw No. 13/93, the *Local Government Act* and the *Community Charter*.

FURTHER THAT the Council of the District of Hope has considered the duty to consult regarding Official Community Plan Amendment Bylaw No.1539, 2023 and concurs with the Director of Community Development that consultation be undertaken with the Ministry of Transportation & Infrastructure, the District of Hope Director of Finance, and the District of Hope Director of Operations.

# **RECOMMENDATION #2:**

THAT District of Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 1540, 2023 be given first and second readings in order to rezone the property legally described as Lot 6, Except Part on Plan 73383 Section 1 Township 5 Range 27 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> Meridian New Westminster District Plan 17065; PID 010-311-637; 61954 Estell Road from Rural (RU-1) to Light/Service Industrial (I-2); and

FURTHER THAT the public be notified in accordance with the District of Hope Application Procedures and Public Hearing/Information Meeting Procedural Bylaw No. 13/93, the *Local Government Act* and the *Community Charter*.

# **ANALYSIS:**

### A. Rationale:

<u>Proposal</u> – The applicant is proposing to rezone the subject 1.3 hectares (~3.3 acre) parcel from the Rural (RU-1) Zone to Light/Service Industrial (I-2) in order to allow for a future industrial development.



<u>Background</u> – The subject property is located in the Silver Creek area and has a single access and egress off the intersection of Estell and Flood Hope Roads. The southernly most property boundary is bound by the Trans-Canada Highway. The nearby land uses in and around the property are as follows: the neighboring properties (east/west) are Rural zoned residences with minor farming activities; the land to the north is zoned Highway Commercial with a card lock facility.

The subject property currently has a one family residence with related accessory buildings on the property. If the land is successfully rezoned, then technically the house would become non-conforming. However, if an industrial use is established in accordance with the possible Light/Service Industrial (I-2) zone, then the house could be considered a legal accessory use. It is not staff's intention that the house be demolished as part of this application, especially due to the housing shortage in Hope.

Official Community Plan Amendment & Rezoning - The Land Use Designation amendment and potential rezoning is supported holistically by the Official Community Plan (OCP) through the community goals. The OCP Land Use Designation for the property is Highway Commercial and technically a Light/Service Industrial (I-2) Zone is not supported

in accordance with the Table of Concordance; however, Council should consider that the available industrial lands are limited within the municipal boundaries and that additional industrial lands will need to be created. In order for the rezoning to occur the Land Use Designation in the OCP needs to change to Light/Service Industry.

For an OCP, Section 475 of the *Local Government Act* states that during an amendment of the OCP we must consider whether consultation with one or more persons, organizations and authorities is required. Staff feels consultation with the Ministry of Transportation & Infrastructure, the Director of Finance regarding the financial impact and the Director of Operations to determine the impact on the Solid Waste Management Plan would suffice for this development.

The site is absent of both municipal sewer and municipal water. The applicant would need to create onsite services for an intended development.

<u>Development Permits</u> – For Council's purposes, if a successful rezoning is achieved, a Rail and Service Corridor form and character Development Permit will be required for the development. Further, a Development Permit Minor for Flood & Erosion will be required for the Floodplain (Moderate to High Flood Hazard) of the Fraser River Floodplain.

# B. Official Community Plan (OCP) Bylaw 1378

From the OCP this proposal could address three aspects of a Hope's Industrial areas community goals:

- "Are clean, attractive, and well-maintained;
- · Contribute to the local economy;
- Minimize negative impacts on the natural environment and human health."

As per the OCP, the three questions to be consistently asked in all levels and types of decision are:

 Does the development move Hope toward our vision and goals for success and sustainability?

This development on a micro-level moves Hope towards our vision and goals for success and sustainability.

Is it aligned with our OCP objectives and policies?

Yes, if the consideration is given to the specific use to be relative to Service Industrial it touches on the following:

- · To retain Industrial Lands to support local economic development.
- Support Light/Service Industry and Heavy Industry uses in designated areas.
- To encourage Light Industrial uses that help to diversify the local economy including light manufacturing, technology, transportation, and non-resource base uses.
- Support innovative methods for servicing Light Industrial developments.
- 2. Is it a flexible platform for future steps towards our vision, goals and objectives?

  This platform is rigid but a must do as it requires following the Local Government Act.

3. Will it provide a good return on investment?

From an industrial tax base perspective, it will provide a return on investment once the contemplated development has been rezoned. Furthermore, it could provide well needed employment.







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# 9.3 RURAL (RU-1) ZONE

### 9.3.1 PURPOSE

.1 The purpose of this zone is to identify lands which, by reason of their resource potential, predominant large parcels, general anability, isolation from urban development or freedom from hazardous conditions, are suited for agricultural, resource, recreational or low density rural uses.

#### 9.3.2 PERMITTED USES

- 1 The following principal uses and no others shall be permitted:
  - a) Agricultural use;
  - b) Golf course;
  - c) Gravel and rock sorting, screening and crushing;
  - d) Hobby farm;
  - e) Kennel;
  - f) Nursery;
  - g) One family residence or mobile home;
  - h) Outdoor recreation;
  - i) Primary processing of forestry products;
  - j) Medical Marihuana Production Facility (AM#1343).
- .2 The following shall be permitted as accessory uses:
  - a) Accessory buildings or structures;
  - b) Accessory produce sales;
  - c) Animal shelters;
  - d) Bed and breakfast;
  - e) Home based business;
  - f) Kennel:
  - q) Outdoor storage;
  - h) Secondary dwelling, employee residence or mobile home. (AM#1352)

### 9.3.3 CONDITIONS OF USE

- .1 On a parcel there shall be no more than:
  - a) 1 one family residence or mobile home; and
  - b) 1 secondary dwelling, employee residence or mobile home as an accessory use. (AM#1352)
- .2 A golf course shall be subject to the Golf Course Use Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .3 A hobby farm shall be limited to parcels with a minimum lot area of 0.8 hectares (2 acres) or larger;
- .4 On a hobby farm the keeping of horses, sheep, goats, cattle or other animals of like kind is permitted in concentrations of three (3) animals or less per 2 acres;
- .5 On a hobby farm the keeping of poultry is permitted in concentrations of six (6) birds or less per 0.1 hectares (0.25 acres);
- .6 Buildings or structures for housing animals associated with a hobby farm shall be subject to the accessory building or structure setback conditions as stated in this zone.

- .7 Operation of a *kennel* or the keeping of animals shall be in accordance with the <u>District of Hope Good Neighbour Bylaw No. 1240, 2008</u> as amended from time to time.
- .8 All mobile homes shall be subject to the Mobile Home Use Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .9 A mobile home, employee residence or secondary dwelling as an accessory use shall only permitted where a one family residence exists. (AM#1352)
- .10 All accessory buildings or structures shall be subject to the Accessory Buildings and Structures General Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .11 The retail area of accessory produce sales including buildings and outdoor areas shall not exceed 300 square metres (~3,227 square feet).
- .12 All animal shelters shall be subject to the Animal Shelter Use Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .13 A bed and breakfast shall be limited to 3 sleeping units.
- .14 All home based businesses shall be subject to the Home Based Business Use Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .15 All *outdoor storage* shall be subject to the Outdoor Storage Landscaping, Screening and Fencing Regulations and the Outdoor Storage Use Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .16 A secondary dwelling shall be subject to the Secondary Dwelling Use Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .17 A Medical Marihuana Production Facility shall be subject to the Medical Marihuana Production Facility Use Regulations of this bylaw. (AM#1343)

### 9.3.4 REQUIREMENTS FOR SUBDIVISION

1 The minimum lot area for a parcel created by subdivision shall be 4 hectares (~10 acres).

### 9.3.5 SITE COVERAGE, BUILDING HEIGHT AND SETBACKS

.1 Site coverage, building height and setbacks shall be provided in accordance with following table:

- .2 A kennel or other structure keeping household animals that is not completely enclosed by a sold fence at least 2 metres (~7 feet) in height, except for runs, shall be setback a minimum of 50 metres(~164 feet) from all interior side lot lines and the rear lot lines of the parcel. (AM #1352)
- .3 Where a kennel or other structure keeping household animals is completely enclosed by a sold fence at least 2 metres (~7 feet) in height, including runs, shall be setback a minimum of 30 metres(~97.5 feet) from all interior side lot lines and the rear lot lines of the parcel. (AM #1352)

### 9.3.6 OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- .1 All off-street parking areas and off-street loading spaces shall be provided in accordance with the Off-Street Parking and Loading Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .2 All *landscaping*, *screening* and *fences* shall be provided in accordance with the Landscaping, Screening and Fencing Regulations of this Bylaw.

# 9.3.7 SPECIAL REGULATIONS

.1 N/A

This summary of the subject zone is provided as a quick reference for those seeking information about land use and development in Hope. While every effort has been made to ensure its accuracy, you are advised to consult the full text of the Zoning Bylaw, and other relevant documents, before optioning, buying, or selling land, or making financial commitments related to these matters.



# 12.2 LIGHT/SERVICE INDUSTRIAL (I-2) ZONE

### 12.2.1 PURPOSE

.1 The purpose of this zone is to accommodate lands suited for light or service industrial use located south of Downtown Hope or in site specific locations along transportation routes, either within an enclosed structure or in an open area under conditions designed to minimize conflicts with surrounding areas.

# 12.2.2 PERMITTED USES

- .1 The following *principal uses* and no others shall be permitted:
  - a) Auction sales and storage;
  - b) Beverage bottling and distribution;
  - c) Building supply and lumber yard;
  - d) Bulk fuel, heating oil and propane storage and distribution;
  - e) Car wash;
  - f) Cartage, delivery and moving service;
  - g) Cold storage plant and frozen food locker;
  - h) Commercial vehicle storage;
  - Equipment sales, service and rental;
  - j) Household and other small appliance sales and service;
  - Industrial operation involved in the processing, fabricating, assembling, storing, transporting, distributing, testing, servicing, repairing, wholesaling or warehousing of goods, materials and things;
  - Light manufacturing, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing woodworking, metalworking and machine shops;
  - m) Log house construction;
  - n) Manufacturing and storage of pavement and concrete products;
  - o) Mini-storage facility;
  - p) Printing, publishing and allied trades;
  - q) Public works yard and related storage;
  - Recycling depot accepting, storing and processing solid waste products;
  - s) Towing operation and associated vehicle storage;
  - Truck terminal, bulk loading and storage facility;
  - u) Truckstop;
  - v) Vehicle sales or rental operation;

# LIGHT/SERVICE INDUSTRIAL



- We hicle service or repair including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, body repair and painting;
- x) Veterinary clinic;
- y) Warehousing;
- z) Wholesaling providing for the selling of goods in relatively large quantities within a *building* to retailers for resale to consumers;
- aa) Workshop and yard for construction companies and trade contractors.
- .2 The following shall be permitted as accessory uses:
  - a) Accessory buildings or structures, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, materials handling equipment, scales and storage buildings.
  - b) Commercial vehicle storage;
  - c) Office accessory to the operation of any of the principal uses permitted in this zone;
  - d) One family residence;
  - e) Outdoor storage;
  - f) Restaurant.

### 12.2.3 CONDITIONS OF USE

- .1 All activities within this zone shall be carried out in accordance with the <u>District of Hope Good Neighbour Bylaw No. 1240, 2008</u> as amended from time to time.
- .2 Commercial vehicle storage outside a building as a permitted principal use shall be limited to that part of the parcel surfaced with asphalt, concrete or similar hard surface and shall not exceed a total site coverage of 50%.
- .3 A mini-storage facility shall:
  - a) be completely enclosed within a building; and
  - have adequate on-site drainage works and shall not drain onto or create a drainage hazard for an adjacent parcel.
- All individual storage units within a mini-storage facility shall have:
  - a) direct access at the ground level and a maximum interior height of 3.3 metres (~11 feet); and
  - b) a floor area of not less than 2.8 square metres (~30 square feet) and not more than 28 square metres (~301 square feet).
- .5 There shall be not more than 1 one family residence on a parcel.
- .6 No side of a one family residence shall have an overall dimension of less than 6 metres (~20 feet) excluding additions and projections.
- .7 Excluding a mini storage facility, the *one family residence* shall be located behind the *principal* use.
- .8 All accessory buildings or structures shall be subject to the Accessory Buildings and Structures General Regulations of this Bylaw.

# LIGHT/SERVICE INDUSTRIAL



- .9 An accessory building or structure for security personnel (watch person) shall not exceed a floor area of 20 square metres (~215 square feet).
- .10 An accessory office shall not exceed 25% of the floor area of the principal uses on the parcel.
- .11 All *outdoor storage* shall be subject to the Outdoor Storage Landscaping, Screening and Fencing Regulations and the Outdoor Storage Use Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .12 The *floor area* of a *restaurant* as an *accessory use* shall not exceed 70 square metres (~753 square feet).

### 12.2.4 REQUIREMENTS FOR SUBDIVISION

- .1 The minimum lot area for a parcel created by subdivision shall be:
  - a) 930 square metres (~10,005 square feet) where there is a *community water system* and a *community sanitary sewer system* available to service the *parcel*; or
  - b) 0.4 hectares (~1 acre) where there is either a *community water system* or a *community sanitary* sewer system but not BOTH available to service the *parcel*; or
  - c) 1 hectare (~2.5 acres) where there is neither a community water system nor a community sanitary sewer system available to service the parcel.

.3 Where a Light/Service Industrial (I-2) Zone adjoins or abuts a Residential Zone, all buildings and structures in the I-2 Zone shall be setback a minimum of 7.5 metres (~25 feet) from the boundary of each parcel that adjoins or abuts in the Residential Zone.

### 12.2.6 OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- .1 All off-street parking areas and off-street loading spaces shall be provided in accordance with the Off-Street Parking and Loading Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .2 All *landscaping*, *screening* and *fences* shall be provided in accordance with the Landscaping, Screening and Fencing Regulations of this Bylaw.

#### 12.2.7 SPECIAL REGULATIONS



# PURPOSE:

To obtain authorization for staff to proceed with the legislative process in order to rezone the properties at 21636 and 21696 Thacker Mountain Road in order to construct a duplex on each of the properties.

# RECOMMENDATION:

THAT District of Hope Zoning Amendment Bylaw, No. 1542, 2023 be given first and second readings in order to rezone the properties legally described as Lots 9 & 10 Section 15 TWP 5 RGE 26 W6M YDYD Plan 33448; PID 002-494-311 and 003-195-384; 21636 and 21696 Thacker Mountain Road from Single Family Residential (RS-1) to Two Family Residential (RT-1); and

FURTHER THAT the public be notified in accordance with the District of Hope Application Procedures and Public Hearing/Information Meeting Procedural Bylaw No. 13/93, the *Local Government Act* and the *Community Charter*.

### ANALYSIS:

### A. Rationale:

<u>Proposal</u> – The applicant would like to rezone the two neighbouring properties at 21636 and 21696 Thacker Mountain Road in order to construct a duplex on each of the parcels. In order to allow the construction of a duplex on the properties, a rezoning from the Single Family Residential (RS-1) zone to a Two Family Residential (RT-1) zone is required.

<u>Background</u> – The properties have sat vacant since the original subdivision of the lands in 1982 when the area was under jurisdiction of the Regional District of Fraser Cheam. The lots are serviced with municipal water and sewer.

Rezoning / Official Community Plan Bylaw – The proposed rezoning from Single Family Residential (RS-1) to Two Family Residential (RT-1) is supported by the Official Community Plan (OCP) and therefore, a change in the OCP Land Use Designation for this property is not required in order for this rezoning to occur.

<u>Development Variance Permit (DVP)</u> – The intended build for the two lots is to be duplexes (two family residences). In accordance to the condition of use found in the RT-1 zone that permits a duplex to exist is: "...A parcel for two family residence must meet the minimum lot area for subdivision requirements as stated in this zone for such use." The requirement is 7,478 square feet (sq ft); however, both parcels are just shy of meeting the requirement:

- 21636 Thacker Mountain Road parcel size is approximately 7361.64 sq ft. If this
  rezoning is successful, then a 116.36 sq ft relaxation would be requested to be varied
  in the anticipated DVP process.
- 21636 Thacker Mountain Road parcel size is approximately 7230 sq ft. If this
  rezoning is successful, then a 248 sq ft relaxation would be requested to be varied
  in the anticipated DVP process.

Council should note that the rezoning can continue even if the size requirement is not met from the outset of the application. Hypothetically, if the rezoning was successful and the variances were not, the developer is still permitted to build a single family dwelling with an optional suite.

Geotechnical Hazards Development Permit (DP) — Prior to making application, it was encouraged by staff, that a hazard assessment be conducted due the properties being identified in a High Geotechnical Hazard DP area. A hazard assessment or Development Permit is not a requirement for a rezoning; however, Staff also didn't want to put Council in a position where they felt hesitant to approve the rezoning because of the unknown degree of hazard on the subject site. The applicant did get a hazard assessment which will aid the development. A DP would be anticipated depending on the result of the rezoning.

<u>Public Notification</u> – As per the requirements detailed in the *Local Government Act* and District of Hope Bylaw 13/93, properties in the vicinity will be mailed out notifications informing them of the applicant's proposals plus signage will be posted on the site(s) and ads placed in the local paper.

### B. Official Community Plan (OCP) Bylaw 1378

As per the Official Community Plan, the three questions to be consistently asked in all levels and types of decision are:

 Does the development move Hope toward our vision and goals for success and sustainability?

This development on a micro-level moves Hope towards our vision and goals for success and sustainability.

Is it aligned with our OCP objectives and policies?

Yes, it touches on the following:

- To concentrate and mix compatible land uses to enable cost-effective and economically sustainable maintenance of public infrastructure.
- To support a variety of housing types, lot sizes, and densities to meet the changing needs of current and future residents.
- To ensure that Hope has a suitable land base to meet its future residential, commercial, industrial, and open space needs.
- To promote and facilitate the development of market and non-market affordable housing.
- To prioritize development in the District's urban areas.
- To encourage proposals that integrates affordable housing throughout the community, rather than segregate or concentrate it in specific areas.
- 2. Is it a flexible platform for future steps towards our vision, goals and objectives?

  This platform is rigid but a must do as it requires following the Local Government Act.
- 3. Will it provide a good return on investment?

  From a residential tax base perspective, it will provide additional needed housing.





# 10.1 SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL (RS-1) ZONE

#### 10.1.1 PURPOSE

.1 The purpose of this zone is to accommodate single detached residential use on land serviced by community water and sanitary sewer systems.

- .1 The following *principal uses* and no others shall be permitted:
  - a) One family residence.
- .2 The following shall be permitted as accessory uses:
  - a) Accessory buildings or structures;

  - e) Home based business;
  - f) Preschool.

- .1 There shall be no more than 1 one family residence on a parcel.

#### 10.1.4 REQUIREMENTS FOR SUBDIVISION

- .1 The minimum lot area for a parcel created by subdivision shall be:
  - a) 460 square metres (~4,950 square feet) where there is a *community water system* and a *community sanitary sewer system* available to service the *parcel*; or
  - 925 square metres (~9,951 square feet) where there is either a community water system or a community sanitary sewer system but not BOTH available to service the parcel;

- c) 0.8 hectare (2 acres) where there is neither a *community water system* nor a *community sanitary sewer system* available to service the *parcel*.
- .2 The minimum *frontage* of a *parcel* shall be 10% of the perimeter of that *parcel* or 15 metres (~49.5 feet), whichever is greater:
  - a) In the case of where a *parcel* or the majority of a *parcel* fronts the bulb of a cul-de-sac road, the minimum *frontage* shall be 9 metres (~29.5 feet); or
  - b) In the case of panhandle lots, where the panhandle access strip shall be at least 6 metres (~20 feet) wide at all points and the panhandle front lot line shall approximate the required width of a regular parcel in this zone, at the discretion of the Approving Officer.
- .3 The minimum *depth* of a *parcel* shall be 30 metres (~97.5 feet).

#### 10.4.2 PERMITTED USES

- .1 The following *principal uses* and no others shall be permitted:
  - a) One family residence;
  - b) Two family residence.
- .2 The following shall be permitted as accessory uses to a one family residence only:
  - a) Accessory buildings or structures;
  - b) Bed and breakfast;
  - c) Boarding;
  - d) Day care;
  - e) Home based business;
  - f) Preschool;
  - g) Secondary suite.
- .3 The following shall be permitted as accessory uses to a two family residence only:
  - a) Accessory buildings or structures;
  - b) Home based business.

#### 10.4.3 CONDITIONS OF USE

- .1 There shall be no more than 1 one family residence or 1 two family residence on a parcel.
- .2 No side of a *one family residence* or *two family residence* shall have an overall dimension of less than 6 metres (~20 feet) excluding additions and projections.
- .3 A parcel for two family residence must meet the minimum lot area for subdivision requirements as stated in this zone for such a use.
- .4 All accessory buildings or structures shall be subject to the Accessory Buildings or Structures General Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .5 A bed and breakfast shall be limited to 3 sleeping units.
- .6 Boarding of not more than 2 persons shall be permitted in a one family residence only.
- .7 Day care as an accessory use to a one family residence only shall be limited no more than 8 children in care.
- .8 All home based businesses shall be subject to the Home Based Business Use Regulations of this Bylaw.
- .9 There shall be no more than 1 secondary suite per one family residence on a parcel.

- .10 A secondary suite shall comply with the British Columbia Building Code, as amended from time to time and shall include:
  - a) A maximum suite area of 90 square metres (~968 square feet) or 40% of the dwelling unit floor area, whichever is less;
  - b) A minimum room height of 2.0 metres;
  - c) Fire separation of suite from remainder of the dwelling unit; and
  - d) That the creation of a strata lot pursuant to the Strata Property Act for a secondary suite shall not be permitted. (AM#1352)

#### 10.4.4 REQUIREMENTS FOR SUBDIVISION

- .1 The minimum lot area for a parcel created by subdivision for a one family residence shall be:
  - a) 460 square metres (~4,950 square feet) where there is a community water system and community sanitary sewer system available to service the parcel; or

  - c) 0.8 hectares (~2 acres) where there is neither a community water system nor community sanitary sewer system available to service the parcel.

  - a) 700 square metres (~7,478 square feet) where there is a community water system and community sanitary sewer system available to service the parcel; or
  - t) 1,125 square metres (~12,103 square feet) where there is either a community water system or a community sanitary sewer system but not BOTH available to service the parcel; or
  - c) 1 hectare (~2.5 acres) where there is neither a community water system nor community sanitary sewer system available to service the parcel.
- .4 All parcels for a two family residence shall have:
  - a) a minimum frontage of 10% of the perimeter of that parcel or 20 metres (~66 feet) whichever is greater; and
  - b) a minimum depth of 30 metres (~97.5 feet).
- .5 Where a residential *parcel* is subdivided for the purpose of creating a *two family residence* in the form of side by side *dwelling units* for individual ownership, the new *parcel* so created shall contain not less than 1/2 of the minimum *lot area* and 1/2 of the minimum *frontage* required in this *zone* for a *two family residence*.


